Tip Sheet for Controlled Drug Audits

Key Things to Remember:

- ☑ Audits must be performed on all controlled drugs regardless of the frequency of its use.
- ☑ The licensed veterinarian must review the controlled drug logs monthly.
- ☑ Audit must be completed monthly (every 21 31 days)

Other Useful Tips:

☑ If an audit was missed due to staff availability, make note of the reason, and complete the audit as soon as possible.

☑ To ensure a verifiable monthly inventory, a suggestion is to pre-schedule it each month and perform it on a consistent day of the week.

☑ If the seal on the bottle is unbroken, assume the amount indicated on the bottle is the same.

☑ To measure the amount of liquid controlled drugs, instead of drawing up the liquid in a syringe, consider 2 alternative methods:

- Place a small sticker on the bottle cap with the amount written on it. Every time an amount is used, subtract that amount from the total and place a new sticker on the cap with the amount remaining in the bottle. Example: Bottle has 10 mL. When 2 mL is used, place a new sticker on the cap indicating 8 mL is remaining in inventory.
- 2). Using an empty bottle of the same drug, draw lines on the empty bottle with the amounts in milliliters (mL) written at each line. For example: place 5 mL of water in the empty bottle and mark that amount. Now, you can use it to visually compare with the bottle in use to know how much remains.
