Regulations & the Veterinary Professionals Act

The *Veterinary Professionals Act* grants the Transition Council the ability to propose regulations. This process is now underway. Learn more about the process and the concepts under consideration.

Steps for developing regulations

- 1. College staff drafts regulatory concepts.
- 2. Transition Council reviews draft concepts.
- 3. Following discussion, Transition Council may approve the draft concept for consultation or send it back to staff for further work.
- 4. Once finalized, all draft concepts will be circulated for consultation by the College.
- 5. Transition Council reviews the consultation feedback and may revise the draft concepts.
- 6. Draft concepts are sent to the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture, Food, and Agribusiness, who will develop the regulatory language.
- 7. The provincial government holds a consultation on the draft regulations.
- 8. Consultation feedback is considered by the provincial government.
- 9. Draft regulations are finalized and approved by the Executive Council of Ontario.
